United Way Quad Cities - United for Schools What does it all mean?

TITLE I SCHOOL

High percentage of families from low-income households, based on two factors:

- Poverty estimates
- · Number of students receiving free and reduced priced lunch



United Way Quad Cities currently works in five local Title I schools:

- · Davenport: Madison Elementary & Jefferson Elementary
- · Moline: Washington Elementary
- · Rock Island: Rock Island Academy Elementary
- 27 different languages spoken
- · East Moline: Wells Elementary
- · More than 40 languages and dialects spoken

STUDENT FAMILY & RISK FACTORS

Conditions or characteristics that increase the likelihood of a student experiencing academic, social, or emotional difficulties. These factors can be categorized as either student-specific or family-related, and they can significantly impact a student's overall well-being and educational success.

Attendance/Chronic Absenteeism

Students who miss 10% or more of the school year typically. That's 18+ days or more in a 180-day academic year. Common factors include: lack of transportation, poverty, lack of basic needs, and family disruption. Chronic absenteeism at United for School sites is more than 4x higher than at Non-Title I schools:



- UFS locations: 38% chronically absent
- Title I schools: 28% chronically absent
- · Non-Title I Elementary Schools: 9% chronically absent

Behavior

Influenced by trauma, family disruption, assimilation (refugee families), behavior disorders, and mental health concerns. United for Schools sites have over 5x as many annual suspensions compared to Non-Title I elementary schools.



- UFS locations: 177 average annual suspensions
- Title I: 76 average annual suspensions
- Non-Title I: 32 average annual suspensions

Course Performance

Risk factors include language barriers and lack of basic needs. Proficiency in English Language Arts at Non-Title I elementary schools is 4x higher compared to United for Schools locations. Percentage of students equals:



- UFS: 21% proficient in English Language Arts
- Title I: 41% proficient in English Language Arts
- · Non-Title I: 85% proficient in English Language Arts
